Checklist for Temporary Food Service

The following list is intended to help you plan for outdoor and special events. It is not intended to be an all-inclusive list of equipment and supplies needed. Equipment requirements may differ from operation to operation.

- Initial Container/spray bottle with sanitizing solution and wiping cloths
- Initial Chlorine or quaternary ammonia test strips for sanitizer
- Initial Hand washing set-up: Covered container with free-flowing dispensing valve, disposable paper towels, liquid soap, and wastewater collection container
- Initial Mechanical Equipment to maintain all cold foods at 41°F or lower
- Initial Mechanical Equipment to maintain all hot foods at 135°F or higher; NO HEAT LAMPS
- Initial Cooked foods CANNOT be left out longer than 4 hours
- Initial Disposable gloves NO bare-hand contact with Ready-to-Eat foods (ie. bread, salads)
- Initial Clean Clothing and hair covering (caps, bandanas, chef hats); NO JEWELRY
- Initial Serving spoons, spatulas, tongs, scoops, etc.
- Initial Plastic wrap and/or aluminum foil for covering food
- Initial Probe-type thermometer (0-220°F) for measuring food temperatures (accurate to +/- 2°F): Calibrated as needed
- Initial Adequate number of tables with washable nonabsorbent and sealed surfaces
- Initial Adequate number of trash cans and plastic garbage bags
- Initial Thermometers for inside of all cold storage units
- Initial Appropriate sanitizer test strips
- Initial Overhead protection or canopy
- Initial Food MAY NOT be prepared/cooked at an unlicensed facility (i.e. residential)
- Initial Original copy of Seminole Tribe Temporary Food Service Permit.
- Initial Dispensers for condiments (IE: prepackaged, squeeze bottles, hinged lid containers)
- Initial Cleaning supplies (dish soap, sanitizer, brooms, trash bags, garbage cans with lids)
- Initial Dunnage racks or pallets to store all food and paper goods six inches off the floor.
- Initial Consumer advisory provided (if serving raw/undercooked animal foods)
- Initial Adequate protection from flying insects, vermin, dust, dirt and weather.
- Initial 3 compartment sink setup (Sanitizer: chlorine or quaternary ammonia)
- Initial No minors under age 15; No animals/pets

Checklist for Mobile Food dispensing Vehicle

The following list is intended to help you plan for outdoor and special events. It is not intended to be an all-inclusive list of equipment and supplies needed. Equipment requirements may differ from operation to operation.

- Container/spray bottle with sanitizing solution and wiping cloths
- Chemical test kit provided (for manual sanitizing or wiping cloth containers)
- Three-compartment sink installed and working properly. Drain boards provided (or equivalent shelving installed).
- All hot and cold holding units working correctly and provided with thermometers; stem thermometer, properly scaled (0 – 220F) available to measure food temperature.
- Cooked foods CANNOT be left out longer than 4 hours (see page 3 for reference)
- Disposable gloves NO bare-hand contact with Ready-to-Eat foods (ie. bread, salads)
- Serving spoons, spatulas, tongs, scoops, hair restraints, etc. NO JEWELRY
- Fresh water/wastewater tanks installed with proper plumbing connections; wastewater tank at least 15% larger by volume than freshwater tank.
- Probe-type thermometer (0-220°F) for measuring food temperatures (accurate to +/- 2°F); Calibrated as needed
- All floors, walls and ceilings smooth, non-absorbent and easily cleanable; weather stripping installed (as necessary) around outer openings
- Generator installed (if applicable)
- Liquid soap/ disposable paper towels/handwashing signs at hand wash sink; hot/cold water provided/functioning at all sinks.
- Food MAY NOT be prepared/cooked at an unlicensed facility (i.e. residential)
- Original copy of Seminole Tribe Temporary Food Service Permit.
- Dispensers for condiments (IE: prepackaged, squeeze bottles, hinged lid containers) (if applicable)
- Cleaning supplies (dish soap, sanitizer, brooms, trash bags, garbage cans with lids)
- Lights installed and functioning; light shields installed.
- Consumer advisory provided (if serving raw/undercooked animal foods)
- Adequate protection from flying insects, vermin, dust, dirt and weather.
- No minors under age 15; No animals/pets

GENERAL RELEASE AND COVENANT NOT TO SUE**

I, _____, the undersigned, herein after Releasor, for and in consideration of being permitted to utilize camping facilities during the period of February 5, 2027 through February 7, 2027 in connection with the 2027 Seminole Tribal Fair and Pow Wow, 54th Annual Celebration of Native Arts and Culture with the Seminole Tribe of Florida on the Hollywood Seminole Indian Reservation (hereinafter "Premises") do hereby voluntarily assume the risks and consequences of utilizing camping facilities in connection with the 2027 Seminole Tribal Fair and Pow Wow, 54th Annual Celebration of Native Arts and Culture on said Premises. The Releasor hereby knowingly, freely, and voluntarily releases, waives, acquits, and discharges the United States of America, the Seminole Tribe of Florida, the Seminole Tribe of Florida, Inc., Seminole Gaming, the Seminole Indian Communities and any of their Tribal Council members, Tribal members, officers, directors, employees, agents, shareholders, and volunteers together with their heirs, personal representatives, successors, assigns, all referred to as Releasees, from liability to me, my representatives, assigns, heirs, and next-of-kin for all loss or damage, and any claims therefore brought by, or on behalf of, me on account of injury to my person or property, or resulting in my death.

Releasor agrees to indemnify the Releasees and each of them from any loss, liability, damage or cost Releasees may incur due to presence of Releasor in or on the Premises whether caused by the negligence of Releasees or otherwise, or by persons who may be on the Premises lawfully or otherwise.

Releasor assumes full responsibility for and risk of bodily injury, death, or property damage due to negligence of Releasees, or otherwise, while Releasor is in or on the Premises and utilizing camping facilities in connection with the 2027 Seminole Tribal Fair and Pow Wow, 54th Annual Celebration of Native Arts and Culture.

Releasor agrees on behalf of himself/herself and his/her successors and assigns not to institute any action or suit at law or at equity against the Releasees, nor to assist in the institution or prosecution of any claim, demand, action or cause of action for damages, costs, loss of services, expenses, or compensation by any other person or entity, and to indemnify and hold harmless Releasees from any and all claims brought by, or on behalf of himself/herself.

Releasor agrees that this Release, Waiver, and Indemnity Agreement is intended to be as broad and inclusive as permitted by the applicable laws of the United States of America, State of Florida and the Seminole Tribe of Florida. If any portion of this Agreement is held invalid, it is agreed that the balance shall, notwithstanding, continue in full legal force and effect.

Releasor, being 18 years of age or older, in consideration of being permitted to attend and utilize camping facilities during the period of February 5, 2027 through February 7, 2027 in connection with the 2027 Seminole Tribal Fair and Pow Wow, 54th Annual Celebration of Native Arts and Culture on the Premises does for himself/herself, his/her heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns hereby release and forever discharge said Releasees, their heirs, administrators, and executors of and from any and every claim, demand, action or right of action, of whatsoever kind of nature, either in law or in equity, arising from or by any reason of any bodily injury or personal injuries, known or unknown, death and/or property damages resulting or to result from any accident which may occur as a result of attendance and utilization of camping facilities in connection with the 2027 Seminole Tribal Fair and Pow Wow, 54th Annual Celebration of Native Arts and Culture on the Premises whether or not due to negligence of the Releasees.

Releasor further states that he/she has carefully read the above Release, and that Releasor knows the contents of the Release and understands it and agrees to be bound by its terms and signs this Release of his/her own free act.

This Release contains the entire agreement between the parties to this Agreement, and the terms of this Release are contractual and not a mere recital.
